Catch is, must only take 2 minutes to tell us, please!.



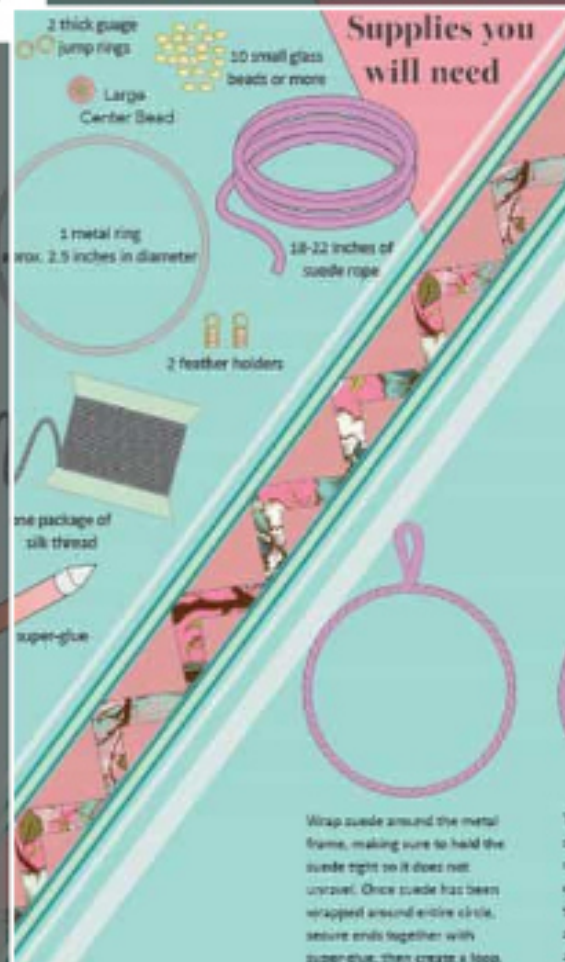
Nushka's Challenge

Supplies you will need

How to make a Dream Catcher



Wrap suede around the metal frame, making sure to hold the suede tight so it does not unravel. Once suede has been wrapped around entire circle, secure ends together with superglue, then create a loop.



Tie the end of the silk thread securely to the top of the circle, making sure the knot won't slide out of place. Next, wrap the thread over the circle, and then around (this should create a loop around the metal frame).



Position loop roughly one inch from the top of the circle, and pull tight. Continue this step until you have completed one full circle of loops. There should be an odd number of loops. (excluding loop in step four).



Repeat loop described in step two, but position loop on right side of the "center". Before tightening, repeat loop a second time around, but this time on the left side. Pull tight.



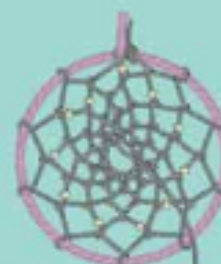
Bring the thread over and around the first line of thread, creating the same loop as before, but this time around the first section of webbing you have completed.



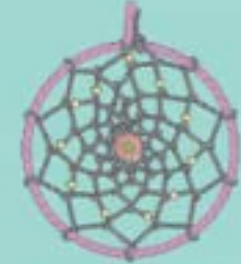
Before each loop, string a small glass bead onto the thread and push the bead all the way down. The bead should always be on the left side of the loop you are creating.



Once round is complete, continue to create the same loops, this time looping the thread around your second round of webbing. Make sure to be consistent with which side of the loop the bead is positioned.



Continue to create circles of webbing, looping over and around each section of thread between the previous loops. Once there is a small space left in the middle of the webbing (about 1 cm in diameter), it is time to string on your bead! Make sure to push it all the way to the center, keeping tension on the thread at all times.



Adjust the center space according to the bead size. Once happy with the results of the webbing, tie a couple knots into the section of thread directly below the bead.



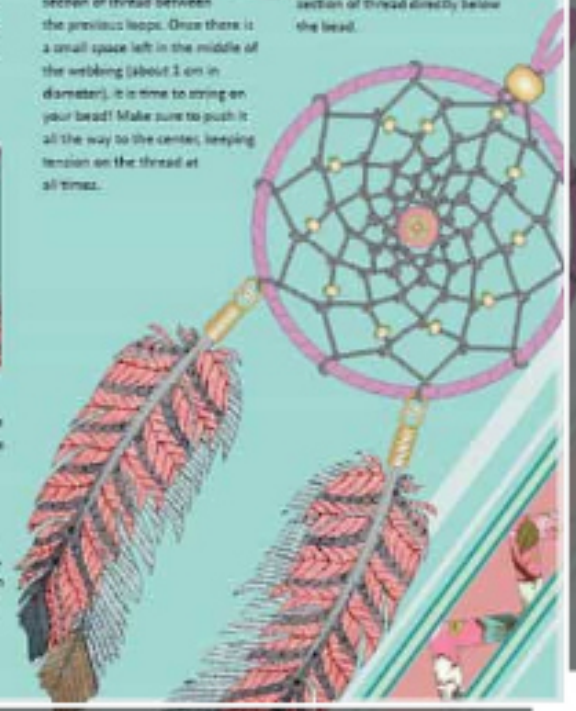
Once the knot is made and a dot of superglue has been applied to the knot, it is time for the feathers. Choose a few for each side, trim, and then arrange in the order you would like. Apply a generous amount of super-glue to the ends and place inside the feather holder. Let set for one minute.



Open jump-ring and slide ring of feather holder onto the jump-ring.

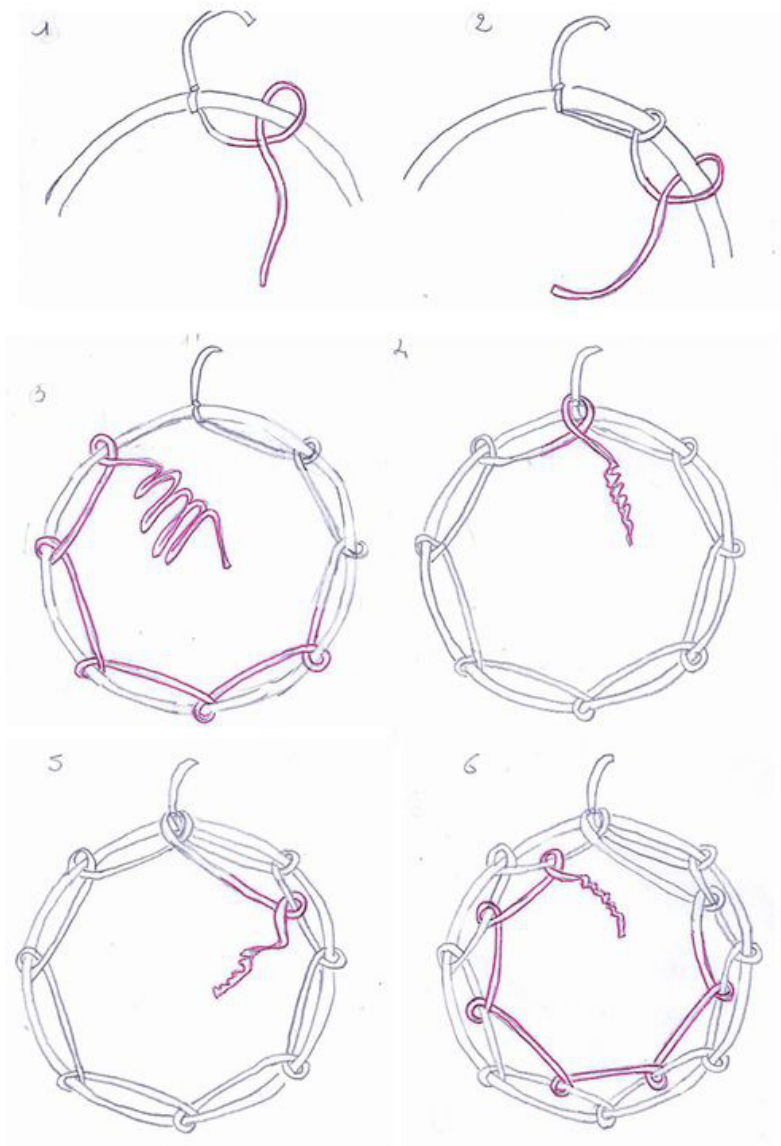


Holding the jump-ring with beading pliers, attach ring to the thread loop on either side of the center loop. Once ring is attached to the thread, close jump-ring with pliers. For the last touch, thread a bead over the suede loop and thread knot, located at the top of your dream catcher. Now you are finished!



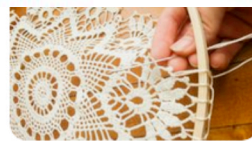

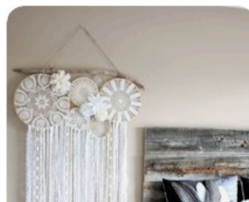
